**WEBCAST OF "SALUTE TO TROOPS" CONCERT
DEBUTS ON
VALENTINE'S DAY**

**Internet Broadcast Premiere of Texas Burning Concert
Looks to Raise Funds for Military Support Group**

San Antonio, TX —Two days before the dedication ceremony for The Center for the Intrepid, a state-of-the-art rehabilitation facility at Brooke Army Medical Center for military personnel catastrophically disabled in Iraq and Afghanistan, Texas musician Patricia Vonne hosted "A Lone Star Salute to Our Troops," the special debut presentation of "Texas Burning," a televised concert series produced by Rampant Entertainment. The concert was originally broadcast live on the Texas Burning website from San Antonio's historical Charline McCombs Empire Theatre via the global broadband networks of Texas-based WhiteBlox on January 27, 2007.

Rampant Entertainment announced today that its broadcast premiere of the concert video will take place on Valentine's Day, February 14, 2007. By accessing the "Video on Demand" feature on the "Texas Burning" website, viewers can share a special Valentine's Day concert with friends and family around the world.

"Most every deployed soldier is missing their lover. And their lover is missing them. On this Valentine's Day, we hope our military families can share a great night of music. It's a wonderful opportunity for music fans to show their support of our brave troops and their families" says Anthony Cutrona, "Texas Burning" Executive Producer.

The online broadcast includes interactive features that will allow the troops, their families, and the entire audience to chat with each other in real time from around the globe. "We are honored to be a part of broadcasting this moving tribute to our troops and their families, who along with all the other fans will be able to watch the concert on the Internet from anywhere in the world," says Greg Demetriades, Chairman and CEO of WhiteBlox.

Beginning at 7:00 p.m., in every U.S. time zone, music fans can enjoy two and half hours of concert performances by logging on to www.texasburning.com. Those who aren't able to access a computer then will still be able to enjoy the show since it will not start until the user registers on-line. The pay-per-view concert is available for \$3.99 for one-month of unlimited viewing. Viewers will enjoy 29 songs, from 7 different recording acts on IPTV (Internet Protocol TV), as a streaming video. The concert video will remain available "on demand" on the website through April 2007.

In the spirit of Valentine’s Day, \$2.00 of each \$3.99 fee will be donated to the military family support organization, Operation Homefront, a national non-profit that provides emergency support and morale to the U.S. military, the families they leave behind during deployment and the wounded warriors when they return home. “As a non-profit, we really appreciate the recognition of our organization and the chance to raise awareness of not only us, but of all military support organizations that provide valuable services to the deployed soldiers and their families” says Karla Ayala, President of the Texas Chapter of Operation Homefront.

Along with Vonne, performers include roots-rock singer-songwriter Shannon McNally; folk-gospel-blues singer Ruthie Foster; Austin guitar goddess Carolyn Wonderland; Internationally renowned Houston blues-man Sherman Robertson; New Orleans’ favorite singer-violinist, Theresa Andersson; and Austin poetic songster Sam Baker.

Mattson Rainer, program director and on-air personality at FM 92.1 KNBT in New Braunfels, Texas serves as emcee of the event. “We knew we had a great line-up of talented musicians. Every artist had a remarkable performance and together created a truly memorable night of music. There will be lots of great music made in Texas this year, but there won’t be a more inspiring concert experience,” says Rainer.

“The concert was filmed using state-of-the-art high-definition television production facilities all recorded in HD 1080i,” says John Frazier of Rollin’ Films, an award-winning producer and director who leads the “Texas Burning” production team. “The quality of video and audio production is as good as it gets and delivers a memorable television experience.”

Rampant Entertainment announced last month its development of the new televised concert series originating from San Antonio. “Texas Burning,” which looks to pair legends of Texas music with young rising artists, will originate from the spectacular Majestic Theatre and Charline McCombs Empire Theatre. First concert date in the series from the Majestic Theatre will be May 26, 2007.

A song by Vonne on her second album, GUITARS & CASTANETS, “Texas Burning,” is the origin of the show’s title and its theme song. Vonne takes her Latin-flavored Texas rock to Europe every year and knows the international appeal of Texas music. “While we love sharing Texas music with fans wherever they are, we are especially proud that my hometown of San Antonio hosted this wonderful concert event,” she says.
